

Table 1, Sections A, B, and C is a report of Children Receiving Early Intervention Services in Accordance with Part C, also known as Child Count for a cumulative Count for November 2, 2014 through November 1, 2015. This data reflects the number of infants and toddlers with disabilities, ages birth through 2, according to the child's gender and the setting they received the early intervention services; who received early intervention services for the most current 12 months of the year. These children received early intervention services regardless of whether federal IDEA Part C funds or other funds were used to provide these services.
